[TIME ALLOTTED] 2018 NHSAS AND SAT RESULTS (CHRISTI)

DISCUSSION Presentation by Christi

Previous was Smarter Balanced - was replaced with NH SAS (NH Statewide Assessment System) last spring. The test item bank changed from Smarter Balanced, vendor remained the same.

NHSAS includes a Science assessment - added this past Spring. Grade 5 took Science Assessment, same group of students who took the Science NECAP assessment in Grade 4. Assessment data should not be compared.

Grade 11 took SAT School Day.

Achievement & growth reporting for all schools and student subgroups.

Timberlane's two main subgroups are students with educational disabilities and economically disadvantaged.

State has set indicators for growth and achievement. If a school does not indicators, additional levels of support would be offered.

Reviewed percent proficiency TRSD compared to US state

SAT School Day mathematics Gr. 11, we have 3 years of data - a different cohort of students each year.

We exceeded the state average in most instances.

Data is used for all students to progress

Sarah - What about Opt out students

Christi- affects participation rate if we don't hit rate, the state calculates if we are under 95%. Students are counted as 0% if lower than 95% participation. Our rate is around 98%.

Schools are using assessment information to plan instructionally for students, ensuring alignment to the taught curriculum, needed resources, and to plan professional learning.

Data has helped informed action planning including varied instructional practices,

personalized goal setting, monitoring student's progress overall, and RTI action planning at the school level.

There has been a collaboration between educators for focused professional learning for teachers of mathematics.

We can't compare year to year with the Tests that we had in the past.

iPlatform has taken the place of the School District Report Card – lots of data available through iPlatform and can be accessed through the DOE site.

Testing is done in Spring – attempting to assess later to gain more instructional time before testing.

Data slides show high-level data. Each of the schools are drilling down further for more specific data & gap filling. Teachers look at sample items especially 3rd grade who will be taking it for the first time. Practice tests can be helpful.
