- Current text is outdated (2001) and isn't used any more
- Enrollment in Psych courses has been consistent
- We have enough copies of a newer class (2018) to use in a class as a reference and a tool, but not enough for all students; this isn't necessarily the text that the course wants to use moving forward
- Spring semester (2020) classes would like to not use the outdated text
